1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The South African Human Rights Commission (SAHRC) is a Constitutional body established in terms of the Constitution of South Africa, 1996 as well as the South African Human Rights Commission Act, 40 of 2014. The SAHRC is under the strategic leadership of Commissioners. The administration of SAHRC is overseen by a Chief Executive Officer (CEO).
- 1.2 SAHRC has presence in all nine Provinces within the Republic of South Africa. There is an Internal Audit unit which is comprised of the Chief Audit Executive, Senior Internal Auditor and Internal Auditor, supported by an Administrator.

2. OBJECTIVE

2.1 The objective of this Request for Proposal (RFP) is to appoint a suitably qualified service provider to render co-source services as support to the Internal Audit unit. We are looking for two Auditors (Senior Auditor and Auditor) to assist with delivery of Human Resources Management, Risk management & Fraud prevention, Compliance review, Audit of Pre-determined Objective and follow-up on up on open audit findings.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICE

3.1. Human Resources Management

Review the adequacy and effectiveness of the control environment on the following processes:

- **3.1.1.** Appointments, promotions, disciplinary, resignations/retirements, staff movements.
- **3.1.2.** Leave management.
- **3.1.3.** Performance management.
- **3.1.4.** Training and Development plans management.
- **3.1.5.** Compliance with Human Resources related legislation.
- **3.1.6.** Payroll

3.2. Risk management and Fraud prevention

Review the adequacy and effectiveness of the control environment on the following processes:

- **3.2.1.** The Commission's risk management framework, policies and procedures.
- **3.2.2.** Risk mitigation plans.
- **3.2.3.** The Commission's Fraud Prevention strategies and plan.

3.3. Compliance review

The scope will cover the following areas:

3.3.1. Review the Commission compliance with all relevant applicable laws, legislations, regulations and guidelines within the core operations.

3.4. Open audit findings

The scope will cover the following areas:

- **3.4.1.** Follow-up on internal audit open audit findings
- **3.4.2.** Follow-up on other external assurance findings

3.5. Audit of Pre-determined Objectives

The scope will cover the following areas:

3.5.1 Review the adequacy and effectiveness of the procedures and policies governing the management and reporting of performance information.

3.5.2 Audit the reported performance information and validate it to ensure valid, accurate and complete performance reporting.

4. DELIVERABLES

- 4.1. Conduct an adequacy and effectiveness review of human resource management, risk management & fraud prevention compliance review, Audit of Pre-determined Objective and follow-up on open audit findings within the Commission.
- 4.2. Engage with relevant SAHRC staff and management.
- 4.3. Completion of audit file as per SAHRC audit methodology.
- 4.4. Prepare a complete audit report comprising of detailed findings, root causes, recommendations and corrective action plans to be implemented.

5. PRICING

- 5.1. A detailed price breakdown outlined on table 2 below must be completed and a service provider must include other items, if required.
- 5.2. Refer to Annexure A for Pricing Structure

6. PROJECT TIMELINES

7. EVALUATION CRITERIA

Bids will be evaluated on 80/20-point system as outlined in the PPR of 2022.

The proposals will be evaluated in three phases:



7.1 Phase 1: Mandatory Documents

- 7.1.1 Bid proposal
- **7.1.2** Central Supplier Database Summary Report.
- **7.1.3** SBD1, 4 & 6.1. (Standard Bidding Documents) forms must be completed fully and duly signed.
- **7.1.4** Proof of Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) at least 1 of the Auditor.

Note: Bidders who fail to comply with the mandatory requirements will be disqualified.

All compliant quotes received will be evaluated based on the following criteria: functionality criteria will be further evaluated on applicable values as outlined below:

Evaluation on functionality, as in Table 1 below:

 Bidders will be evaluated out of 100 points and are required to achieve a minimum threshold of 70 points.

- ii. The overall score must be equal or above 70 points to proceed to for Price and Specific Goals evaluations.
- iii. Bidders who fail to meet minimum threshold will be regarded as submitting a non-responsive bid and will not be considered for further evaluation on price and preference points. The minimum threshold for qualifying for functionality is 70, assessed as per criteria listed in Table 1 below:

7.2. Phase 3: Price and Specific Goals evaluation

Only Bidders that have met the 70 points thresholds will be considered for price and specific goals. Price and specific goals will be evaluated as follows:

In terms of regulation 6 of the Preferential Procurement Regulations pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act 5 of 2000), responsive bids will be evaluated on the 80/20-preference point system in terms of which points are awarded to bidders based on:

A maximum of 20 points may be allocated to a bidder for attaining their specific goals status level of contributor in accordance with the table below:

8. Confidentiality, independence and objectivity

The service provider will hold all material and information exchanged during the implementation of this project in the strictest confidence and will take all steps necessary to prevent dissemination of this information to any third party, without the prior written agreement of the SAHRC as the SAHRC asserts its moral authority and copyright over the report. The service provider must ensure that its staff maintains their objectivity by remaining independent of the activities they execute.

8.1 THE TOTAL COST WILL BE USED TO CALCULATE POINTS FOR PRICE CLARIFICATION

- i. The SAHRC may request clarity of further information regarding any aspect of the bid. The service provider should supply the requested information within forty-eight (48) hours after the request has been made.
- ii. The SAHRC reserves the right to conduct a security background check or screening of the service provider. The SAHRC reserves the right to conduct mandatory site inspection to the offices of the service provider.

9. CONDITIONS OF TENDER

- 9.1 The SAHRC reserves the right not to award the tender.
- 9.2 Any conditions imposed by the service provider that is restrictive or contrary to any part of these Terms of Reference will automatically disqualify the service provider.
- 9.3 The service provider will be held liable for any damage or loss suffered by the entity, because of the service provider's
 - own or his/her employees' negligence or intent, which originated at the site. The service provider will have to pay damages or replace any stolen item damaged or stolen due to the negligence or intent of the service provider's own employees.
- 9.4 The service provider must, at his/her own expense, take out sufficient insurance against any claims, cost. loss and/or
 - damage ensuing from his/her obligations and shall ensure that such insurance remains operative for the duration of this agreement.
- 9.5 A copy of such insurance contract must be handed to the SAHRC Representative on commencement of the service.
 - Evidence that such insurance premiums have indeed been paid or is sought must be furnished on request.
- 9.6 SAHRC does not bind itself to accept the lowest quote.
- 9.7 The SAHRC reserves the right to invite bidders for presentation at bidders' own cost and perform site visits on short listed
 - bidders before the award of the bid, as part of evaluation process.
- 9.7.1 SAHRC does not bind itself to make any selection from the proposals or quotations received.
- 9.7.2 SAHRC reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to cancel this request for proposals and/or not to make any selection of the service provider/s at all.

- 9.7.3 SAHRC reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to cancel this request for proposals and/or not to make any selection of the service provider/s at all.
- 9.8 All prices quoted must be VAT inclusive.
- 9.9 SAHRC will not make any upfront payments before the rendering of services.
- 9.9.1 The successful bidder shall provide the service required based on the set timelines and as per the schedule to be provided by SAHRC.
- 9.9.2 A pricing schedule with one of the specified elements omitted from the costing may be considered non responsive.
- 9.10 The price proposal must be valid for 120 days.

10. CONTRACT PERFORMANCE

The performance of the Service Provider shall be reviewed quarterly during the period of the signed Service Level Agreement.

10.2 If it is found that the information provided is false, including the breach of the General Condition of Contract, The SAHRC reserves the right to terminate this contract with immediate effect.

- **11.1** All the official forms (SBD) must be completed and signed in all respects by bidders. Failure to comply will invalidate a bid.

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
 - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,
